Creating Pathways to Prosperity for Underserved Communities in Africa

The U.S. African Development Foundation (USADF) is an independent U.S. government agency established by Congress to invest in African grassroots organizations, entrepreneurs, and SMEs. USADF's investments promote local economic development by increasing incomes, revenues, and jobs. Utilizing a community-led development approach, USADF provides seed capital and local project management assistance to African-owned and -led enterprises addressing some of Africa's biggest challenges around food insecurity, insufficient energy access, and unemployment—particularly among women and youth. Over the last five years (2016–2020), throughout Africa's Horn, Sahel, and Great Lakes regions, USADF has invested more than US\$117 million dollars directly into over 1,000 Africanowned and -operated entities and impacted over four million lives.

INVESTING IN COMMUNITIES

Challenge: The 5,000+ farmers in Tarakwo Diaries Private Limited Company PLC had low capacity to pasteurize bulk quantities of milk, resulting in low revenue and inadequate milk supply from farmers.

Action: USADF provided for Tarakwo to train farmers on improving pasture and fodder production, procure modernized milk processing/pasteurization and packaging machines, and enhance artificial insemination capabilities.

Results: With USADF's investment, milk production for some cows increased from 15 liters to 20 liters, and others from 5 to 12 liters. Additionally, the USADF-sponsored artificial insemination services achieved a 99 percent success rate.

GROWING ENTERPRISES

Challenge: Due to limited pasteurizer capacity, Ndumberi Dairy Farmers Cooperative Society (Ndumberi) could only process 50 percent of milk received from farmers.

Action: USADF invested US\$244K in Ndumberi to construct a cold room for yogurt storage and procure a 14,000-liter pasteurizer and delivery truck.

Results: With USADF's investment, Ndumberi increased the retail price of its pasteurized milk by 67 percent and sell milk and yogurt in new markets in Nairobi and western Kenya.

INCREASING INCOMES

Challenge: Irregular rainfall exacerbated the food security challenges in the pastoralist community of Kakuma in the Turkana North region where Natiira Ateni Self Help Group operates.

Action: USADF invested US\$95K in Natiira Ateni to drill a borehole to ensure a consistent water supply for agricultural production using the drip irrigation system.

Results: With USADF's investment, Natiira Ateni increased its food production, distributed 20 percent of its increased harvest to farmers, and provided training for farmers on sustainable agricultural practices.

BUILDING CAPACITY

Challenge: Due to a lack of refrigeration facilities, Natogo Fish Mongers Self-Help Group could lose up to 30 percent of its fish, limiting revenue for farmers.

Action: USADF invested capital for Natogo to purchase multiple refrigerators with a capacity to preserve 2,000 kg of fresh fish.

Results: With USADF's investment, Natogo increased its preservation capacity, provided a regular market for over 1,500 fishermen, and now sells fish to over 700 retailers that sell to markets and hotels.
