Developing and Expanding Community Enterprises

Creating Pathways to Prosperity for Underserved Communities in Africa

The U.S. African Development Foundation (USADF) is an independent U.S. government agency established by Congress to invest in African grassroots organizations, entrepreneurs, and SMEs. USADF's investments promote local economic development by increasing incomes, revenues, and jobs. Utilizing a community-led development approach, USADF provides seed capital and local project management assistance to African-owned and -led enterprises addressing some of Africa's biggest challenges around food insecurity, insufficient energy access, and unemployment—particularly among women and youth. Over the last five years (2016–2020), throughout Africa's Horn, Sahel, and Great Lakes regions, USADF has invested more than US\$117 million dollars directly into over 1,000 Africanowned and -operated entities and impacted over four million lives.

INVESTING IN COMMUNITIES

Challenge: The sunflower producing cooperative South Mzimba Union Small Holder Farmers Association Limited (SOMU) struggled with frequent power cuts, machine breakdowns, and poor production efficiency.

Action: USADF invested US\$246K in SOMU to construct a warehouse to qualify for Malawi Bureau of Standards (MBS) certification, buy a refinery machine, and train leaders to enhance business processes.

Results: With USADF's investment, SOMU purchased a truck for harvesting produce, constructed a warehouse and laboratory, and partially certified its cooking oil with the MBS.

GROWING ENTERPRISES

Challenge: Lower Shire Rice Marketing Secondary Cooperative Union, a conglomerate of five smaller rice-producing cooperatives, had limited profit due to low rice prices.

Action: USADF invested US\$242K in Lower Shire to certify the Union through the Malawi Bureau of Standards and train its leaders and members on branding and marketing their rice products.

Results: Within one growing season of receiving USADF's investment, Lower Shire provided clean seeds and fertilizers for members and is working on branding and marketing its rice to increase incomes and market share.

INCREASING INCOMES

Challenge: Due to a lack of working capital, Green Impact Technologies was unable to extend its reach and provide energy to rural customers.

Action: USADF invested US\$99K in Green Impact Technologies for it to train its local sales agents, improve business operations, and procure 1,540 solar home systems.

Results: With USADF's investment, Green Impact Technologies deployed 700 solar systems to off-grid communities, recruited and trained ten sales agents, and strengthened its distribution network

BUILDING CAPACITY

Challenge: Chuma Chilimnthaka experienced low yields of its soybeans due to poor organizational structure and financial management and a lack of farm inputs for cooperative members.

Action: USADF invested US\$98K in Chuma Chilimnthaka for it to set up a crop purchase fund and enhance its organizational management.

Results: With USADF's investment, Chuma Chilimnthaka increased its sales revenue by 74 percent and membership more than twofold.
